But what is this show? A musical? A play? A vignette piece? ...well, it's sort of all of the above. Originally set on a train, I pitched the idea of a show made up of vignettes (10-minute, stand-alone scenes), but delivered by an ensemble cast.

We've all experienced that feeling of seeing a stranger in a crowded place and for a moment considering what their life is like; who they are and where they're heading. Where else is this felt so profoundly than at a motorway services? With Simon igniting the engine, the world of Pinkerford was born.

Based on an outline created by the both of us, our team of superb writers - Emma, Hannah, Mohammed and Steph - have created beautiful dialogues that delve into the lives of our characters. My daunting task was to craft the cross-over, with scenes and songs that would unite our disparate travellers.

It's both an unconventional and experimental approach to a new musical piece for sure, but rather than a case of too-many-cooks in the carpool canteen, "Bear Left" has proven to be a well-oiled engine of creativity, each person a different valve or piston bringing their own corner of Pinkerford to life.

Where better than to carry out this road test than the arches of 53two? The daily hubbub here is the perfect parallel for Pinkerford, while the dedicated team are built to solve any problems and rise to any challenge. My huge thanks must go to them, to our phenomenal cast and crew, to Maestro Joe, to ever-supportive families and, of course, to my co-pilot Mr Simon Naylor, who has driven this show with unwavering passion.

Following last year's "Realms Of Glory," we knew we had to come back with something bigger and bolder; a contemporary story for here, for now and for Manchester. We hope "Bear Left" is just that.
